# Cross-cultural Communication: International Communication Issues in Social Media

**Abstract:** The Russian-Ukrainian conflict is one of the critical topics of current research. The previous works start from the impact of conflict on the economy and politics. However, analyzing user comments on conflict under cross-cultural communication still needs a unified explanation and cognition. Therefore, the research topic of this paper is Intercultural Communication: International Communication Issues in Social Media—Taking the Russia-Ukraine Conflict as an Example. Firstly, data preprocessing is carried out, collecting relevant comments on the Russia-Ukraine conflict from Zhihu (a high-quality question-and-answer community on the Chinese Internet and an original content platform where creators gather) and Twitter, removing worthless remarks, and then classifying the data according to gender, time, and domestic and foreign keywords, and then conducting data analysis and analyzing the time of comments Line and data characteristics, and finally modeled using SWOT (Business strategy analysis method) analysis. This paper finds a huge difference between the two by comparing user comments about the conflict between Russia and Ukraine on Zhihu and Twitter. Most of the comments on Zhihu are about emotional vocabulary, while those on Twitter focus more on conflict's economic, political, and social impacts and highlight crosscultural themes. Besides comparing the overall trend of keywords on the two platforms, the research also conducts a detailed analysis of gender in user comments. It is found that the proportion of female users on the Zhihu platform is relatively large, and they occupy a dominant position, while on Twitter, males are still dominant. In order to analyze the reasons for this phenomenon, the research explored the differences between the two and the influencing factors.

## 1. Introduction

Intercultural communication refers to interpersonal communication and information dissemination activities among social members with different cultural backgrounds. Researchers must carry out a detailed micro level, reflecting the differences in cross-cultural communication of each "gene" research. The Russia-Uzbekistan conflict that broke out in February 2022 is the most significant geopolitical event in the 21st century [4]. The impact of the Russia-Ukraine conflict extends far beyond the bilateral relationship. As the U.S. and Western countries impose unprecedented comprehensive sanctions on Russia, the Russia-Uzbekistan conflict and the chain reaction triggered by the sanctions will further spread to the world and have a far-reaching and long-term impact on global security. International order and global governance. In the context of the COVID-19 epidemic and major changes unseen in a century since the outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the geopolitical and economic situation in the Asia-Pacific and Northeast Asia has undergone earth-shaking changes [5]. It is essential to know the relevant information for every war, and it is essential to explore people's attitudes toward the war. An in-depth understanding of war can help people better understand war and deal with the political, economic, and social impacts of war more rationally. Moreover, the survey of people's attitudes towards the war affects the direction of the war and some important decisions to a certain extent.

The number of relevant papers on the Russia-Ukraine conflict is relatively small. Most papers emphasize how the global economy developed under the Russia-Ukraine conflict, how the significant changes unseen in a century have changed, new changes in the political and economic situation, and the impact of the death of breath on a country—and other related topics.

In the experiment, the author first collects and counts the data, then classifies the data, analyzes it from various aspects and angles, and then displays it intuitively in the form of keyword cloud diagrams and tables, and finally uses the swot analysis model to find out the advantages—weaknesses, opportunities, and threats, and address them one by one. Through the investigation and comparison of relevant data, compared with the previous significant wars in history, the Russia-Ukraine conflict has been handled properly in many aspects, but there are still problems in progress. In terms of the progress of this conflict, in the face of the conflict, the two sides took a way not to harm civilians, which strongly reflected the humanitarian concern, and at the same time, adopted the method of combining attack and negotiation, which to some extent stabilized the situation of world peace and effectively prevented the occurrence of the third World war.

During the investigation, it was found that users on social media platforms had different views and concepts on this conflict. The variables come from regional, gender, time, and other factors. With the constant update and development of the situation, people's attitudes have also shown a substantial change. This paper used the Zhihu research to collect relevant comments from Twitter users and

compare them with keywords. Differences were found through comparison graphs, correlation analysis graphs of gender ratio and comment content, correlation analysis graphs of time development, and content change.

With the deepening of the research, it is found that not only is the region the influencing factor, but also the change of different variables such as gender and time. During the research, the author found that cross-cultural influence is huge, and for the Russia-Ukraine conflict, there are significant differences at home and abroad. As for men and women, the number of female speeches on Zhihu has increased significantly, and the themes of communication are gradually becoming more balanced. On Twitter, the main body of communication is still inclined toward men. The analysis may be due to the large base on Twitter. Over time, user comments have also been recorded due to the immediacy of the Internet, thus forming a certain trend.

#### 2. Methods




Figure 1: Survey procedure.

The research procedure is shown in Figure 1. In this study, Zhihu samples were adults (18 years old and above). It is divided into male, female, and unknown users according to the gender of the survey. The sample size of the questionnaire is 2,055 people, and the final valid sample data is 1,661 people, excluding worthless comments. The Twitter sample was adults (age 18 and older). It was divided into male, female, and unknown users according to the gender of the survey. The sample size of the questionnaire was 1098 people, and the last valid sample data was 1079 people, excluding the worthless comments. For example, if unfounded accusations against both parties or comments create panic and anxiety for no reason, this paper manually removes them. The data sample is shown in Table 1.

# 3. Experimental Results and Analysis

# 3.1. Difference Between Domestic and Foreign Keywords

Frequency

As shown in Figure 2, in the domestic comments on the Russia-Ukraine conflict, it can be found that the most frequently appearing words in user comments are emotional, that is, people's emotional expressions about the conflict. This reflects the Chinese people's ability to empathize with war. Of the nearly 2,000 comments on Zhihu, most people have a negative attitude toward the existence of the war. "Longing for world peace" is the original intention of most users, but when they have to face the current conflict between Russia and Ukraine, most are surprised by the emergence of war. Since there have been few wars in China in recent years, Chinese people are more sensitive to wars, so inspirational words account for the vast majority.

In some comments, some users think that the media news contains elements of false propaganda and that cross-cultural communication lacks a certain degree of authenticity. Cross-cultural communication is supposed to use media to obtain the truth. However, communicators sometimes prefer to serve interests, resulting in distorted results and causing users to hold a skeptical attitude

toward network information. This is exactly how the cultural media and the cultural industry work today. It has surpassed the materialistic pursuit of the traditional economy. It is economical based on human nature that satisfies higher needs, so its mind control is far more powerful [3]. Therefore, it has also become one of the important reasons for users' skepticism.

As shown in Figure 3, it can be seen from the figure that the comments on the Russia-Ukraine conflict on Twitter are contrary to the comments on Zhihu in China. Users' emotions about this conflict rarely appear on social media. This may be because there have been local hot wars in some foreign regions, so people have become accustomed to wars. Therefore, most of the speakers mainly focused on the impact of the war on the economy, politics, and life of their respective countries. Keywords such as energy crisis and housing crisis appear in the comments and are the focus of attention. For example, during the conflict in Ukraine, there have been a lot of serious problems that are difficult to deal with: the investment environment has deteriorated extremely; the financial deficit and wage arrears have caused a sharp decline in the living standards of residents; social tension and confrontation have spread [6]. Germany is also adjusting its security policy on a large scale, promoting "re-militarization," increasing foreign military intervention and overseas operations, and taking measures to maintain security in areas including energy, supply chains, and ideology [7]. The reason for this difference may be that foreign wars are more frequent, so they are more inclusive of wars and are more sensitive to and pay more attention to the political, economic, and social impacts of wars.

### 3.2. Gender Share in User Comments





Figure 4: The ratio of men to women in Zhihu comments.

As shown in Figure 4, according to Zhihu user statistics, the proportion of female speakers is much higher than that of males. This phenomenon is in great contrast to the traditional concept. During the investigation and classification by gender, there are many users of unknown gender, and there is also the possibility that potential users may not complete information according to their real gender, women's rights have changed in economy, politics, education level, marriage and family status [8]. However, besides the above uncontrollable factors, the proportion of women discussing political topics is still rising. More than half of the data can prove that women are gradually participating in politics. Facing the world situation, they also have their own unique opinions. This phenomenon shows that the traditional concept of male participation in politics has been changed to a certain extent and gradually broken and disintegrated. However, for now, it is complicated to understand the gender behind unknown users. The research will investigate more credible data to support the point of view and make a point of view clearer.

#### 3.3. Gender Share in User Comments the Trend of User Reviews




Figure 6: Review keywords over time.




Figure 7: SWOT analysis.

Through the above multi-faceted analysis, the research can see the practical application of cross-cultural communication and people's different views on the Russia-Ukraine conflict. According to the principle of the specific analysis of specific situations, different regions adopt different methods of coping with the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, which is also one of the sources of differences. The difference in gender ratio is still worthy of efforts in the follow-up and strives to allow more women to participate in politics. In the future, the operationalization of relevant variables can be further refined to facilitate in-depth research on this topic.
